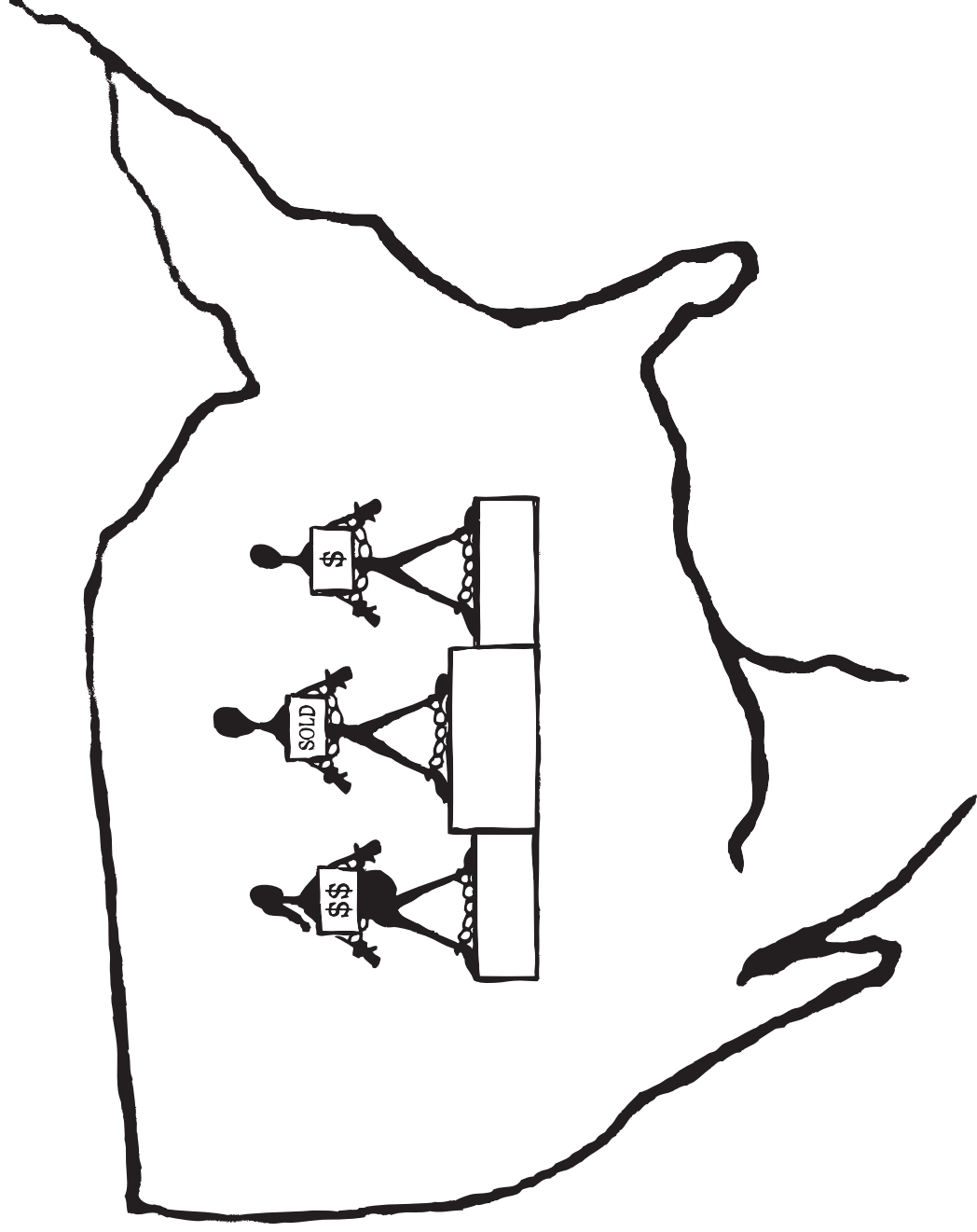


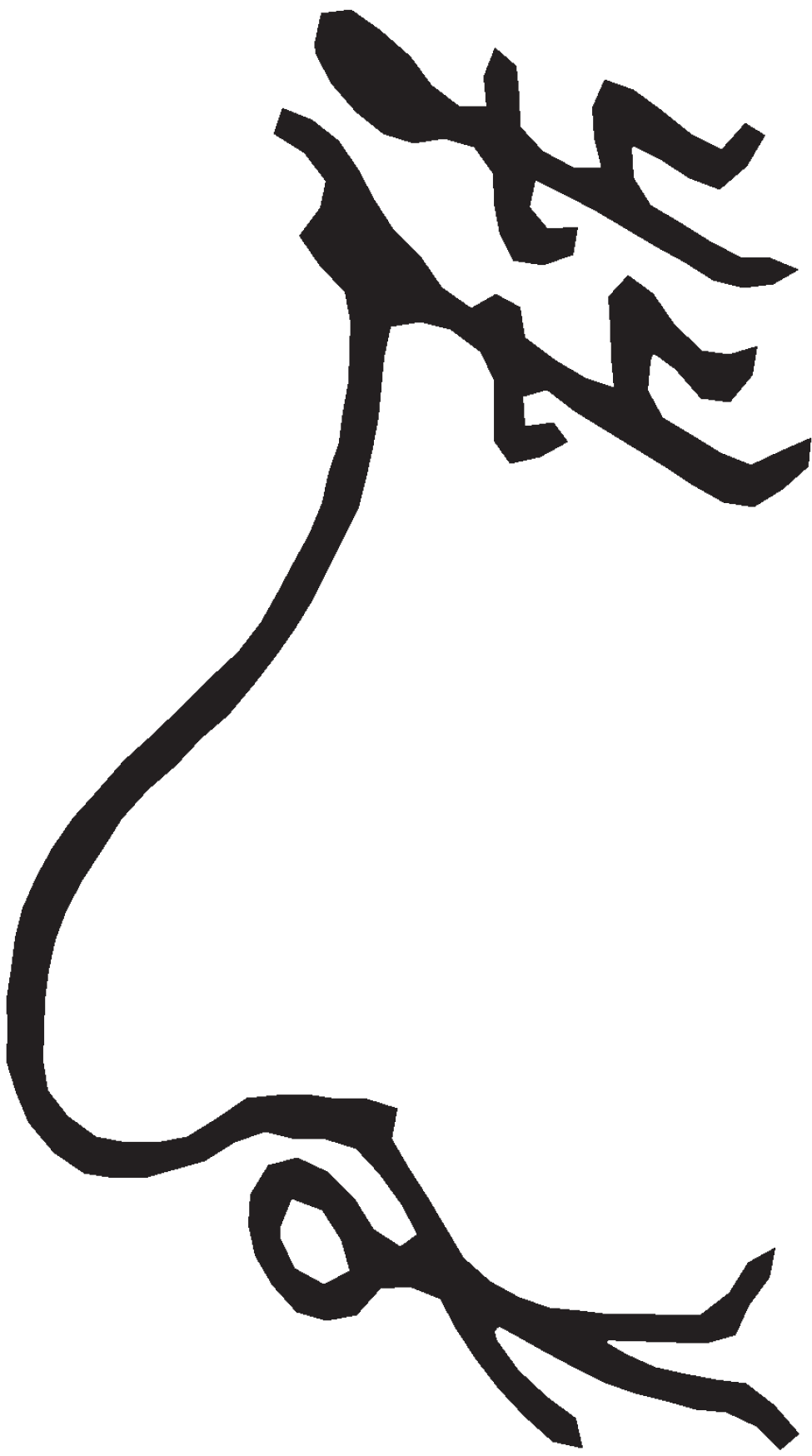
In 1619, the European settlers in America went to Africa and kidnapped millions of Africans.



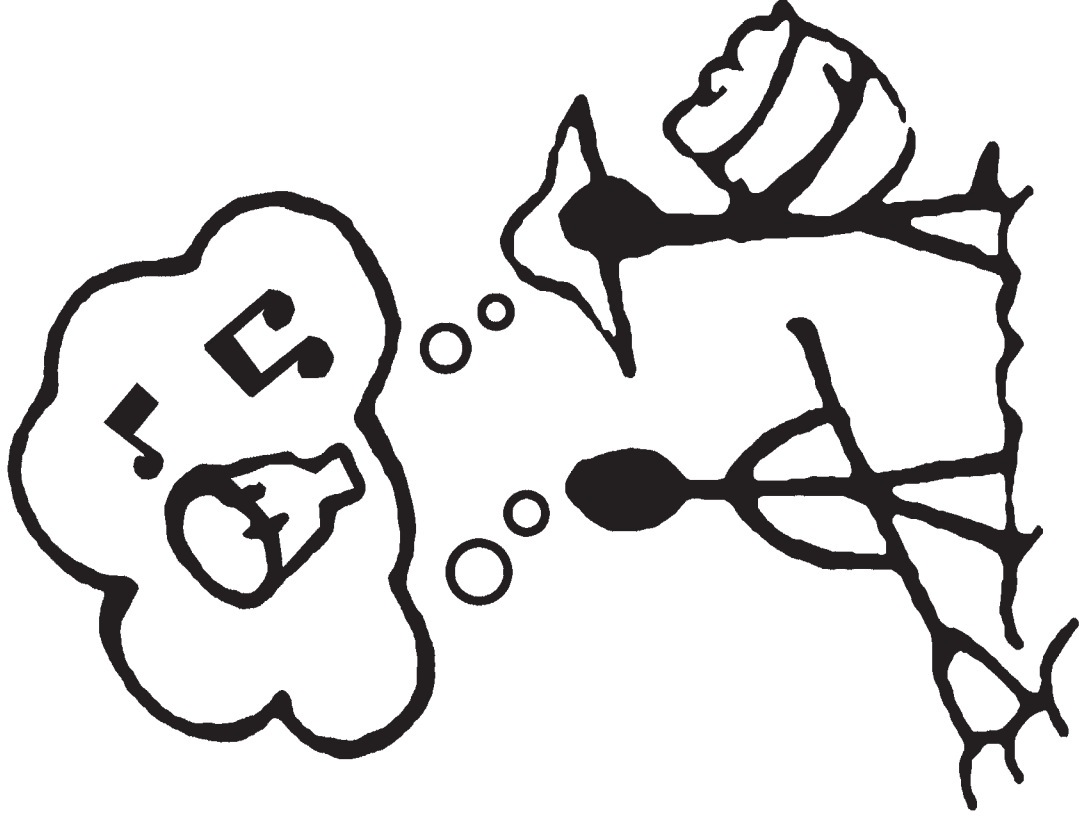
**They put the Africans on boats
and sailed them to America.**



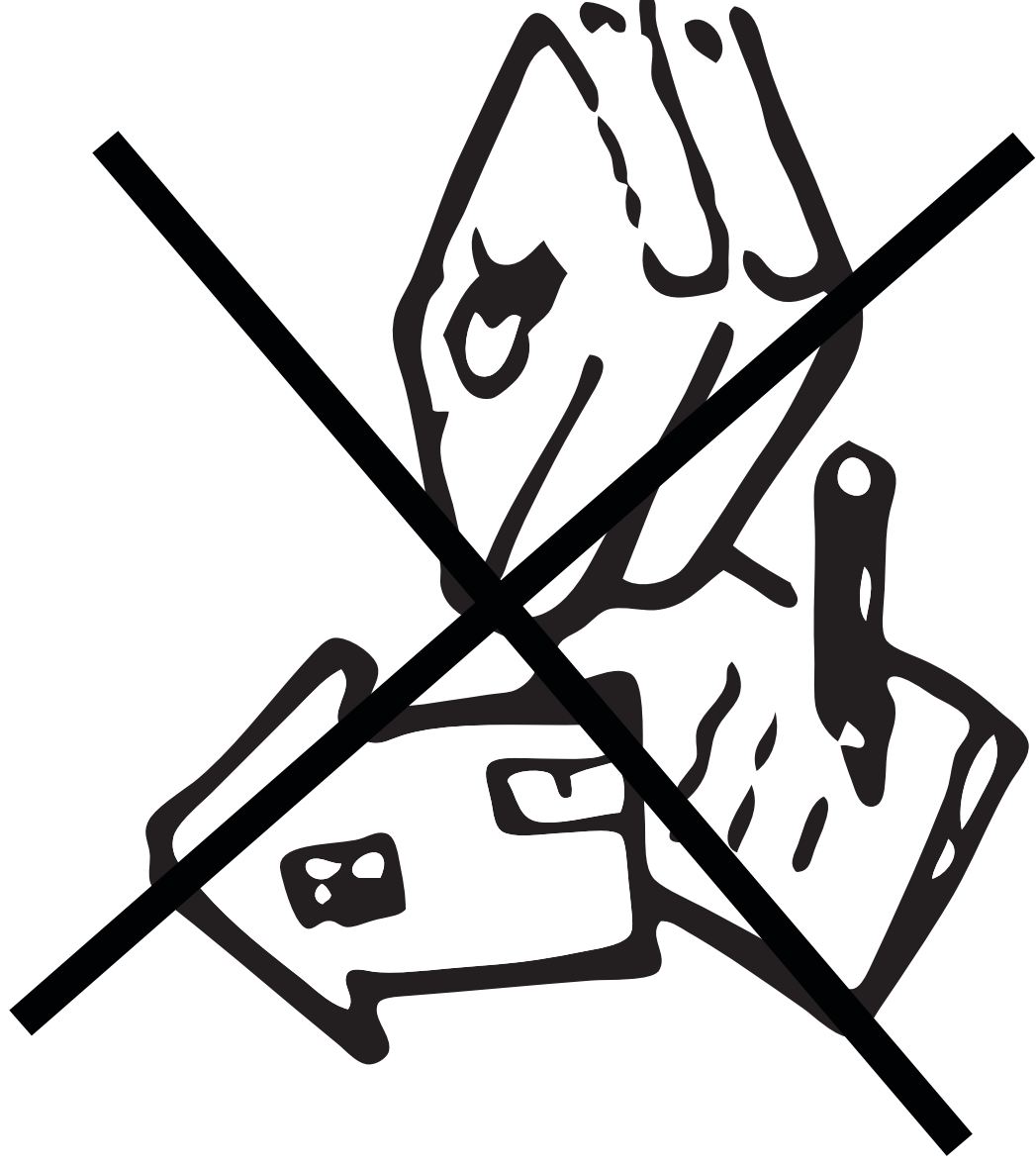
Once the Africans arrived in the US, they were sold to the Europeans in America and forced to work for them for no money at all.



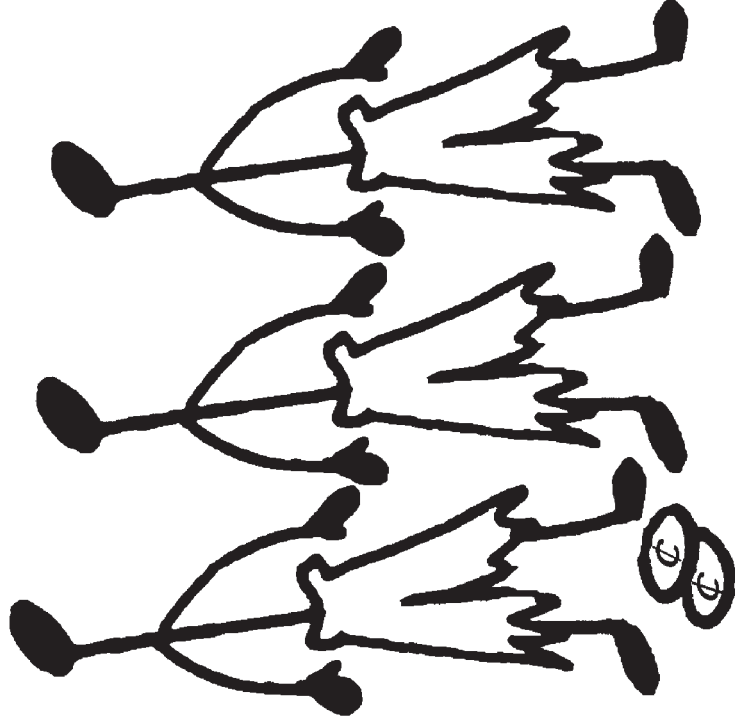
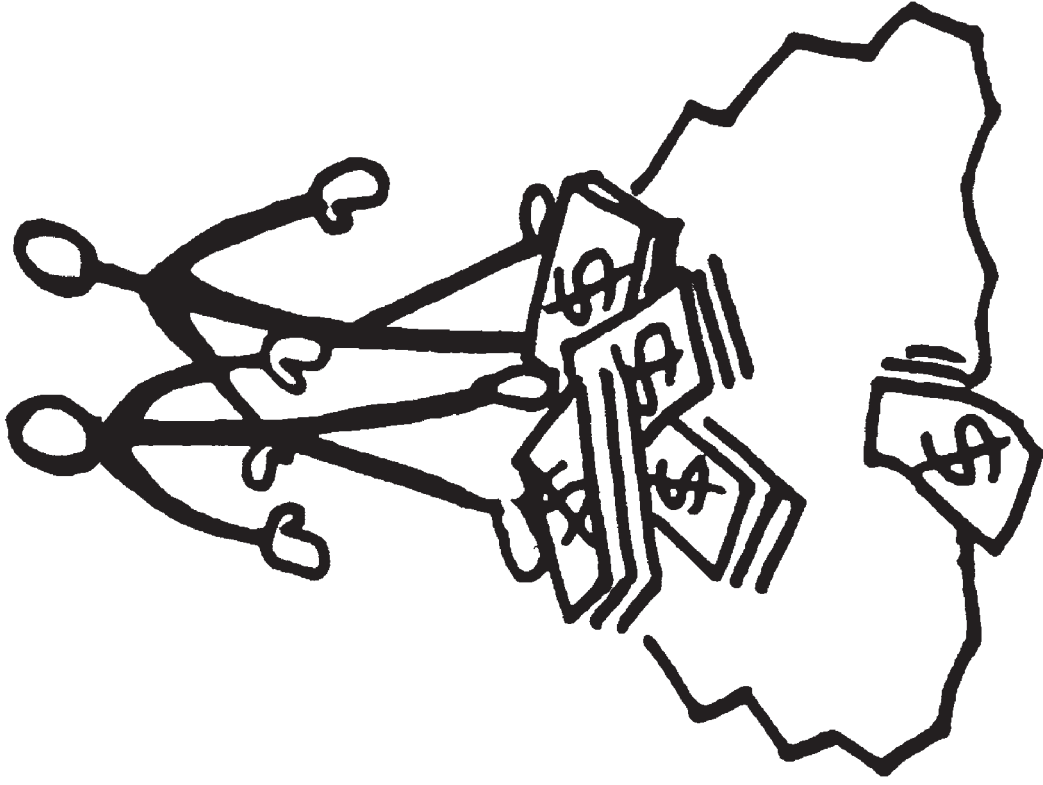
The Africans tried to get away but the Europeans would beat them or kill them if they caught them trying to get away.
